

ROYAL FLEMISH ACADEMY OF BELGIUM FOR SCIENCES AND THE ARTS (KVAB)

The EUIA Conference takes place in the Royal Flemish Academy of Belgium for Sciences and the Arts (KVAB). The Conference is held across several floors of the Academy Palace, which are accessible by lift and stairs. Panels will be held in rooms across the ground and first floors.

GETTING AROUND BRUSSELS

Purchasing a public transport ticket on the bus or tram costs €2.50. If you buy your ticket at a station, you get a lower fare. You also have the option to buy five or ten journeys or a two to three-day pass. A MOBIB card can be obtained at a KIOSK (at stations: Arts-Loi, De Brouckère, Gare Centrale, Gare de l'Ouest, Gare du Midi, Gare du Nord, Louise, Merode, Montgomery, Porte de Namur, Rogier, Roodebeek) or online via the STIB website https://www.stib-mivb.be/abon_tickets.html?l=en.

FROM THE AIRPORT (ZAVENTEM)

We recommend you take the train to Brussels Central Station. Should you choose a taxi, be prepared to pay approximately €60. A journey from the airport may take 30 minutes or more, depending on traffic.

FROM THE AIRPORT (CHARLEROI)

We recommend you take a Brussels City Shuttle to Brussels city centre. The shuttle will bring you to Brussels Midi / Brussel Zuid / Brussels South. The quickest option to the Conference venue is to take the metro line 2 or 6 in the direction of Elisabeth, stop Troon / Trône.

BY METRO

Troon / Trône is the closest metro station to the venue.

BY BUS

Lines 27, 38, 71 and 95 stop at station Troon / Trône.




